GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES

ALL TIMES LISTED IN THE BOOK ARE EASTERN STANDARD TIME

1. Admission

- Livestock Exhibitor Barn Access /Admission Badge \$25, Barn Access, 14 admission/parking scans, provided with Exhibitor Packet at check-in Gate 4.
- Livestock Exhibitor Barn Access Badges If an exhibitor DID NOT purchase a \$25 Barn Access/Admission Badge. Barn Access Badges can be given to an exhibitor upon request in the livestock office.
- Exhibitor Tickets \$44, 11 admission/parking tickets.
- If an exhibitor misplaces a badge, a replacement badge can be re-issued for \$35.00.
- 2. An exhibitor may request an early release only in the event they are participating in an overlapping state fair and live stock show. The request for an early release shall be submitted to the Kentucky State Fair Entry Department and the Livestock Superintendent by August 1. The request shall include the contact information for the indicated state fair and livestock show to confirm participation. Permission will not be granted until the exhibitor's participation is verified by the indicated state fair and livestock show listed in the request.
- 3. Regular entries shall be made through our online entry system at www.kystatefair.org. until July 11 at 11:59 p.m. See specific species for fees and late fees. **No late entries will be accepted in the 4-H/FFA Youth Livestock Show.**
- 4. ALL ENTRIES SHALL BE MADE IN THE NAME SHOWN ON THE REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE. EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE ENTERED SEPARATELY. Reminder review defined entries in youth show vs. open show. Entries in the youth show can only be made in the youth's name and payment for premiums will only be made to the youth registered for the show. (See 4-H/FFA Livestock Rules for non-ownership animals and breed leases.
- 5. A **valid** Social Security Number or Tax ID is required when entering in order to receive a check for premiums won.
- 6. All exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums and two ribbons in each class and only one prize in groups classes. See specific species for exceptions to group classes.
- 7. No phone in entries will be accepted.
- 8. All livestock entries shall enter through Gate 4 off Crittenden Drive. Any vehicle bringing livestock to the Fair which is to remain on the grounds throughout their show period shall park in the area designated by the Superintendent or the Kentucky State Fair Board.
- 9. The moving of stall/pen assignments by exhibitors is not allowed. Violators will be subject to further action by the staff.
- 10. The fair will provide large, portable containers for the disposal of manure and trash. These containers will be in various locations throughout the Livestock Building. No bedding or manure is to be heaped in the area outside of the containers at any time.
- 11. Animals affected by or having been exposed to any contagious disease during the 30 days preceding the State Fair will be excluded from the grounds. In case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease among the domestic animals, the Kentucky State Fair Board will not be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to exhibitors.
- 12. Exhibitors will be allowed to use tents inside the barn; however, if the tents have an overhead cover, a 2A10BC Fire Extin guisher and a working Smoke Detector WILL BE REQUIRED. A representative of the Kentucky Exposition Center will be checking tents throughout arrival and the show to ensure exhibitors are in compliance. Failure to comply can result in removal of tent.
- 13. No guarantee can be made as to the safety of the exhibits, but every precaution will be taken to safeguard the animals.
- 14. Use of portable cooking equipment, including with limitation, microwaves, crockpots, griddles, and other small cooking appliances, is prohibited in animal housing facilities, per State Fire Marshall. See National Fire Protection Association 150, Fire and Life Safety in Animal Housing Facilities Code Chapter 9.12.1.4.
- 15. In order to create a good public image and add to the attractiveness of the livestock, all beds, cots bedding, etc., shall be made up and out of aisles by 8:00 a.m. These rules will be enforced by management.
- 16. No employee of the Kentucky State Fair nor any member of their immediate household can own or exhibit any animals in any competition in which said employee is directly affiliated.
- 17. Any dog on the grounds of the Kentucky Exposition Center during the Kentucky State Fair by law shall be on a leash and controlled by its owner. Service dogs are permitted on the grounds. Any dog running free will be impounded and removed from the grounds. HOWEVER, DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE GOAT AREA.

- 18. First Aid is located on the first floor of the Coliseum, South Wing "C" and outside the West Hall near the W8 overhead
- 19. State Police are located outside the West Hall near the W8 door.
- 20. All market shows at the Kentucky State Fair should be treated as a terminal show. Any animal testing that comes back not fit for the food chain could be eligible for disqualification, ban, and/or prizes and awards revoked. Any substance that has not been approved by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for use in food animals are Prohibited Substances.
- 21. The use or replication of the Kentucky State Fair logo by an outside party is prohibited. Any duplicate awards needed by an exhibitor should be made through the Entry Department.

PROTEST RULES

- I. All protests must be made on the Kentucky State Fair website where all Potential Violations and Protests can be made. All protests must be accompanied by a \$250.00 deposit, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.
- 2. Protests against the exhibition of animals or articles shall be filed at least 24 hours before the awards are made. Protests against awards shall be filed by 8:00 p.m. on the day on which the awards were made, or, in the case of articles judged prior to the opening of the Fair, by 8:00 p.m. on the official opening day of the Fair.
- 3. All protests will be considered at a time set by the Kentucky State Fair Board, and the interested parties will be notified and given the opportunity to submit evidence.
- 4. In addition to the right of protest herein guaranteed to interested parties, the Kentucky State Fair Board expressly reserves the right to take cognizance of fraud, which may have been consummated or attempted, and to take such action as may be deemed just and proper.

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics, fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations that they impose on the local, county, state, provincial, and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards, and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the Kentucky State Fair. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- I. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/ or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event that culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory, and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) that could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices is not acceptable and is prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect, and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant, whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowl edge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action that contravene these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

OUT OF STATE EXPIRED REAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All Swine entering Kentucky for exhibition must call for a unique permit number to be entered on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall be written within 7 days of entry.

All Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Sheep and Goats entering Kentucky from Michigan must call for a unique permit number and additional requirements.

All Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Sheep and Goats entering Kentucky for exhibition must have USDA Official Identification and be accompanied by Certificate of Veterinary inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30days prior to entry.

Livestock exhibiting signs of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease such as, but not limited to, warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or foot rot ARE NOT ELIGIBLE for exhibition and will be refused entry.

ANIMAL IMPORT REQUIREMENTS (COMING INTO KENTUCKY)

302 KAR 20:040. Entry into Kentucky.

RELATES TO: KRS Chapter 257, 9 C.F.R. Chapter I parts 77, 78

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 246.295, 257.030, 257.070, 257.550

NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 257.070 requires that importation of animals into Kentucky complies with administrative regulations promulgated by the board. KRS 257.030 authorizes the board to establish necessary quarantines and other measures to control the movement of animals into, through, or within Kentucky. This administrative regulation establishes health requirements for entry, including entry for sales or exhibition, for livestock and animals into Kentucky.

Section I. General Provisions.

- (I) All animals entering Kentucky shall be subject to the requirements established in 302 KAR 20:020.
- (2) All animals shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or other official movement document except for exemptions listed under each species section of this administrative regulation or 302 KAR 20:065. Examples of an official movement document shall include a way bill with a permit number or Federal Movement Form VS 9-3 or VS 1-27.
- (3) If an entry permit is required by this administrative regulation, it shall be obtained by calling OSV at (502) 782-5901, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. EST to 4:30 p.m. EST. The permit number shall be recorded on the CVI or other required species-specific document obtained pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.
- (4) If the state veterinarian determines based on an epidemiological evaluation of current disease risks that additional requirements are needed to prevent the introduction or spread of disease, the OSV shall direct a person to comply with the additional entry requirements. The notification of additional requirements shall be written or given orally and confirmed in writing.
- (5) All required tests shall be conducted by a state-federal approved laboratory as defined by 9 C.F.R. Chapter 1.
- (6) A CVI for entry shall:
 - (a) Be valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue;
 - (b) Become void upon arrival at the designated destination, except for exhibition animals which may return home within thirty (30) days of the original issue date; and
 - (c) State a valid destination address or PIN.

Section 2. Cattle or Other Bovine Species.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) Cattle or other bovine species for exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes, or for sale purposes except as defined in paragraph
 - (b) of this subsection shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
 - (b) Cattle or other bovine species imported directly to a recognized slaughter center or a state-federal approved stockyard shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
 - (c) Cattle or other bovine species imported to a Kentucky premises from an out of state federally approved livestock market shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4)(d) of this section.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit.
 - (a) All cattle or other bovine species entering the state for sale, exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes shall be

- accompanied by a valid CVI as required by 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(3)(c).
- (b) An entry permit shall be required prior to entry for all cattle or other bovine species except steers, spayed heifers, cattle or other bovine species presented for exhibition only. The permit number shall be recorded on the CVI.
- (3) Specific diseases.
 - (a) Brucellosis.
 - 1. The importation of cattle or other bovine species shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 78.
 - 2. Animals from class free states shall be exempt from testing.
 - 3. Animals originating from a brucellosis certified herd shall be exempt from testing. The herd certification number and date of last herd test shall be indicated on the CVI.
 - (b) Tuberculosis.
 - 1. The importation of cattle or bison shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 77.
 - 2. Animals from class free states shall be exempt from testing.
 - 3. Animals originating from a tuberculosis accredited herd shall be exempt from testing. The herd accreditation number and date of last herd test shall be indicated on the CVI.
 - (c) Scabies. Cattle or other bovine species affected with or exposed to scabies or from an area quarantined because of scabies shall not be eligible for entry into Kentucky except:
 - I. In accordance with 9 C.F.R. Part 73 of the USDA APHIS VS; and
 - 2. If a written permit from the State Veterinarian or an authorized representative is obtained pursuant to 9 C.F.R. Part 73.
 - (d) Ticks. Cattle or other bovine species from a state-federal tick quarantined area, as defined by 9 C.F.R. Part 72, shall not be eligible for entry into Kentucky except:
 - 1. In accordance with 9 C.F.R. Part 72 of the USDA APHIS VS; and
 - 2. If a written permit from the State Veterinarian or an authorized representative is obtained pursuant to 9 C.F.R. Part 72.
 - (e) Johne's Disease. The importation of cattle or other bovine species shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 80.
- (4) Other movements.
 - (a) If cattle or other bovine species from a brucellosis class-free state that is also a tuberculosis class-free state move directly from a farm of origin, they may enter a state-federal approved stockyard in Kentucky without an entry permit or CVI. Those cattle or other bovine species shall meet the requirements established in paragraph (c) of this subsection.
 - (b) Slaughter cattle or other bovine species. Cattle or other bovine species consigned for immediate slaughter may enter Kentucky without an official test for brucellosis or tuberculosis if the cattle or other bovine species are consigned for immediate slaughter to a recognized slaughtering center or to an approved state-federal stockyard as defined by 9 C.F.R. Part 71, for reconsignment to a recognized slaughtering center. Animals diverted en route shall be in violation of this administrative regulation.
 - (c) The seller's name and address and either the animal's premises of origin or PIN shall be provided for cattle or other bovine species imported to a state-federal approved stockyard or directly to a recognized slaughtering center.
 - (d) Cattle or other bovine species moving from an out of state state-federal approved stockyard shall be accompanied by a bill of sale or way bill.

Section 3. Horses or Other Equine Species.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) All horses or other equidae entering Kentucky for any purpose, except as provided in paragraph (b), (d), and (e) of this subsection, shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
 - (b) Equine purchased by a licensed Kentucky dealer at an out-of-state horse sale shall:
 - I. Enter the state on an entry permit;
 - 2. Be accompanied by a VS Form 10-11 or EIA test form verifying a negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test within the last twelve (12) months or shall be tested for EIA within two (2) weeks of entry; or
 - 3. Move directly to an approved Kentucky horse sale.
 - (c) Equine entering the state for racing purposes shall meet the requirements established in KAR Titles 810 and 811.
 - (d) Equine moving directly to a veterinary facility in Kentucky shall be exempt from subsections (2) and (3) of this section.

OPEN LIVESTOCK

- (e) Equine may be moved directly to an approved Kentucky horse sale by an out of state, nondealer owner from that owner's premises.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - (a) A CVI shall be required for equine entering the state except as provided in subsection (I)(b) and (d) of this section and shall meet the criteria established in 302 KAR 20:020, Section I(3)(c).
 - (b) Equine Interstate Event Permits from states participating with Kentucky shall:
 - I. Be accepted for exhibition purposes in lieu of the CVI and EIA test report if they are within six (6) months of the issue date and there has been no change of ownership; and
 - 2. Meet the requirements established in 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(5).
- (3) Equine infectious anemia.
 - (a) All horses or other equidae, except unweaned foals accompanied by their dam, shall be negative to a USDA official test, pursuant to 9 C.F.R. Part 75, within twelve (12) months prior to entry.
 - (b) A copy of the Form VS 10-11 or EIA test form verifying a negative EIA from a laboratory approved by the USDA, pursuant to 9 C.F.R. Part 75, shall be attached to the CVI.
- (4) Approved Kentucky horse sales.
 - (a) Horses or other equidae purchased by a licensed Kentucky dealer out-of-state may move directly to an approved Kentucky horse sale without proof of a negative EIA test.
 - (b) All horses or other equidae presented without proof of a negative EIA test within the previous twelve (12) months shall have a blood sample drawn for EIA testing by the market veterinarian approved by the OSV pursuant to 302 KAR 20:261, at the seller's expense.

Section 4. Swine.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, domestic swine for exhibition, sale, breeding, or feeding shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
 - (b) Swine imported directly to a recognized slaughtering center or a state-federal approved slaughter-only stockyard shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
 - (c) Swine imported to a Kentucky premises from an out of state federally approved stockyard shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
 - (d) Swine listed in this paragraph shall not be imported for any purpose:
 - I. Garbage fed swine;
 - 2. Wild, captive wild, or feral swine, Sus scrofa per definition, including Russian wild boars or Eurasian wild boars; or
 - 3. Swine vaccinated with Pseudorabies vaccine.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit.
 - (a) All swine entering the state for sale except as provided in subsection (1)(b) and (c) of this section, exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes shall be accompanied by a valid CVI as required by 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(3)(c).
 - (b) An entry permit shall be required prior to entry for all swine entering for sale, breeding, or feeding purposes. An entry permit shall be required for exhibition purposes from states with less than Stage 5 Pseudorabies status. The permit number shall be recorded on the CVI.
- (3) Specific diseases.
 - (a) Brucellosis. The importation of swine shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 78.
 - (b) Pseudorabies. Testing shall not be required for swine imported if the swine originated from a Pseudorabies Stage 5 state. Swine originating from a state with less than Pseudorabies Stage 5 status shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 85.
- (4) Swine imported to a state-federal approved livestock market, directly to a recognized slaughtering center, or to a Kentucky premises from an out of state federally-approved stockyard shall be identified with:
 - (a) Official identification in accordance with 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(2); and
 - (b) The seller's name and address and either the animal's premises of origin or PIN.

Section 5. Sheep or Lambs.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) Sheep or lambs for sale except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (d) of this subsection, exhibition, breeding, or feeding

- purposes shall meet established requirements in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
- (b) Sheep imported directly to a state-federal approved stockyard or a recognized slaughtering center shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- (c) Sheep or lambs that originate from known trace, source, or infected Scrapie flocks as determined by the USDA APHISVS in compliance with 9 C.F.R. Part 79 shall not be imported.
- (d) Sheep imported to a Kentucky premises from a state-federal approved stockyard shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit.
 - (a) All sheep or lambs entering the state for sale except as provided in subsection (1)(b) and (d) of this section, exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes shall be accompanied by a valid CVI as required by 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(3)(c).
 - (b) An entry permit shall be required for sheep or lambs entering for sale, breeding, or feeding purposes.
- (3) Specific diseases.
 - (a) Scrapie.
 - I.All sheep shall originate from a Scrapie consistent state meeting the requirements of the USDA APHISVS Scrapie Flock Certification Program established in 9 C.F.R. Part 79.
 - 2. Sheep that require a CVI for movement shall be identified with an official USDA Scrapie Program identification tag or other official identification method and documented on a CVI.
 - 3. If enrolled in the USDA Scrapie Flock Certification Program, the Scrapie Flock number shall be recorded on the CVI.
 - (b) Scabies. Sheep affected with or exposed to scabies or from an area quarantined because of scabies shall not be eligible for entry into Kentucky.
 - (c) Sore mouth. Any sheep or lambs showing lesions of contagious ecthyma shall not be imported.
 - (d) Johne's. The importation of sheep or lambs shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 80.
- (4) Other movements.
 - (a) Sheep or lambs from Scrapie consistent states may be imported into Kentucky for immediate slaughter if consigned directly to a recognized slaughtering center approved by the USDA or the State Veterinarian or to a state-federal approved stockyard or concentration point if reconsignment from that point is to immediate slaughter.
 - (b) Only sheep or lambs from Scrapie consistent states may be imported to state-federal approved stockyards or state-approved concentration points for the purpose of sale.
 - (c) VS Form I-27 shall be required for movement of sheep or lambs from trace, source, or infected flocks to an approved site.
 - (d) Sheep or lambs imported to state-federal approved stockyards, concentration points or directly to a recognized slaughtering center or to Kentucky premises from a state-federal approved stockyard shall be identified with:
 - I.An identification in accordance with 9 C.F.R. Part 79; and
 - 2. The seller's name and address and either the animal's premises of origin or PIN.

Section 6. Goats.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) Goats entering Kentucky for sale except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
 - (b) Goats imported directly to a recognized slaughtering center, a state-federal approved stockyard, telemarketing sale, or KDA approved graded sale shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
 - (c) Goats imported to a Kentucky premises from a state-federal approved stockyard shall meet the requirements **estab** lished in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit.
 - (a) All goats entering the state for sale except as provided in subsection (1)(b) and (c) of this section, exhibition, breeding, or feeding purposes shall be accompanied by a valid CVI as required by 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(3)(d).
 - (b) An entry permit shall be required for goats entering for sale, breeding, or feeding purposes.
- (3) Specific diseases.
 - (a) Scrapie.
 - I.All goats shall originate from a Scrapie consistent state meeting the requirements of the USDA APHISVS Scrapie

Flock Certification Program established in 9 C.F.R. Part 79.

- 2. Goats that require a CVI for movement shall be identified with an official USDA Scrapie Program identification tag or other official animal identification in accordance with 302 KAR 20:020, Section 1(2).
- (b) Brucellosis. Animals six (6) months of age or older shall have an official negative test within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate directly and immediately from a class free state or a brucellosis-certified herd.
- (c) Tuberculosis. Animals six (6) months of age or older shall have an official negative tuberculin test within sixty (60) days prior to entry or originate directly and immediately from a class free state or a tuberculosis-accredited herd.
- (d) Scabies. Goats affected with or exposed to scabies or from an area quarantined because of scabies shall not be eligible for entry into Kentucky.
- (e) Johne's. The importation of goats shall comply with 9 C.F.R. Part 80.
- (4) Goats of any age entering a state-federal approved Kentucky stockyard, KDA-approved graded sale, telemarketing assembly point, a Kentucky recognized slaughtering center, or a Kentucky premises from a state-federal approved stockyard shall be identified with:
 - (a) An identification in accordance with 9 C.F.R. Part 79; and
 - (b) The seller's name and address and either the animal's premises of origin or PIN.

Section 7. Poultry, Farm-raised Upland Game Birds, or Other Avian Species.

- (I) General requirements for entry.
 - (a) Birds four (4) months or older for sale or exhibition purposes shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
 - (b) Chicks or hatching eggs imported shall meet the requirements established in subsections (2) and (3)(a)2 of this section.
 - (c) All birds imported to an approved slaughter facility and all commercial birds moving between a company's production units shall meet the requirements established in subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- (2) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. All poultry shall be accompanied by:
 - (a) An NPIPVS Form 9-3 as specified in 9 C.F.R. Part 145 including flock number issued; or
 - (b) A CVI verifying a valid test date.
- (3) Specific diseases.
 - (a) Salmonella pullorum.
 - I. Birds four (4) months of age or older shall be negative to an official Salmonella pullorum test within thirty (30) days of entry or originate from a NPIP flock. The NPIP flock number or both the test date and the laboratory of test shall be recorded on the CVI.
 - 2. Chicks or hatching eggs shall originate from NPIP flocks or a flock that satisfies the requirements of KRS 257.410.
 - (b) Avian influenza. All poultry shall comply with the requirements of 302 KAR 20:250, Avian influenza.
- (4) Other movements.
 - (a) Commercial birds moving between company units shall have a way bill or log sheet stating origination of birds and intended destination with flock NPIP number.
 - (b) Birds going directly to an approved slaughter facility shall provide the name and address for premises of or

HOW TO OBTAIN AN IMPORT PERMIT?

Accredited veterinarians can use either option 1 or 2 for livestock Import Permits.

- 1. Veterinarians can use the Online Permitting System to obtain an Import Permit.
- 2. Import Permits can also be obtained by calling the Kentucky State Veterinarian's Office at (502) 782-5901.

ACCEPTED FORMS OF OFFICIAL IDENTIFICATION

The following types of Official ID are accepted in Kentucky.

- Animal Identification Number (AIN) tag: 840 prefix or other country code I5-digit tag (this includes EID/RFID button tags, visual non-RFID panel tags, RFID panel tags, matched pair visual/RFID tag set, Industry "Logo" tags [must be 840], Ultra High Frequency (UHF) tags)
- National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) metal tag: State code prefix, two/three alpha, four digit serial tags (commonly referred to as "Silver" or "Brite" tags) used for program disease testing, interstate movement, change of ownership
- Brucellosis Vaccination metal tag: similar to the NUES tag, but orange to indicate that the animal has been Calfhood vaccinated for Brucellosis
- Scrapie Flock tag: white plastic panel tag with flock ID, or metal serial tag with flock ID, or metal serial tag distributed by our office
- Swine Premises Identification Number (PIN) tag: plastic tag used for slaughter swine
- Other form of identification not mentioned, as long as it is printed with an Official US Shield
- Registration Tattoo, with official breed registry papers (this is an acceptable ID within Kentucky, but the show/exhibition you're attending may not accept this)
- NO LONGER ACCEPTED: 900 & USA prefix series manufacturer tag, unless it was placed on an animal before March 11, 2015

KENTUCKY ANIMALS

All Kentucky Origin Swine shall be individually identified with USDA Official Identification on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection written within 7 days of entry.

All Kentucky origin cattle, sheep, and goats for exhibition shall be individually identified with USDA Official Identification on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection written within the current calendar year, January I through December 31, 2023.

Please note that 302 KAR 20:065, Section 2 (3) (c) states that 'Cattle or other bovine species infected with warts, ringworm, or any other communicable disease shall not be eligible for exhibition'.

INTRASTATE EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS (MOVEMENT FOR SHOW WITHIN KENTUCKY)

302 KAR 20:065. Sale and exhibition of Kentucky origin animals in Kentucky.

For animals that are traveling within the state of Kentucky for exhibition, they should have an Official ID listed on a current calendar year Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI). If you plan to attend multiple shows throughout the year, a generic destination of 'Kentucky Shows & Fairs' is acceptable for Kentucky origin animals and those CVIs will remain valid until December 31st of the current year, with the exception of Equine (see below). However, CVIs written with a specific destination listed or for a change of ownership are only valid for 30 days and will be void upon arrival at that destination. A CVI written for exhibition purposes shall be void upon change of ownership of the listed animal(s).

Equine CVIs are valid until the Coggins test has expired, or one year from the last test date (i.e. your Coggins test was on March 1st this year and your CVI was written on April 10th this year, your Coggins and CVI will both expire on March 1st next year). However, if your Coggins test was completed after your CVI was written, your CVI will expire one year from the date it was signed by an accredited veterinarian.

An entry fee of \$75.00 per head (includes pre-bedded stalls) will be charged for all entries submitted by July 11. An entry fee of \$25.00 per head will be charged on 4-H/FFA entries.

Open Late Entries: A late entry fee of \$125.00 per head will be charged for all entries submitted after July 11. Late entries shall be submitted through the on-line entry system by 11:59 p.m. on July 18. No late entries will be accepted in the 4-H/FFA Youth Livestock Show.

NEW THIS YEAR:

Group classes can be made at entry time on the on-line entry system.

Stalling and Setup

All exhibitors wanting to be grouped together shall send an email directly to Open Beef Superintendent, Rob Amburgey, robert.amburgey@uky.edu.

- Indoor stalling will be available Tuesday, August 22 at 8:00 a.m. for set-up.
- 2. All stalls are pre-bed. If additional bedding is needed, only baled or bagged bedding is allowed.
- Entry fees do not dictate stall space. Exhibitors will
 receive one stall for each animal delivered to the Fair,
 regardless of the number of entries
 made. Additional tack stalls are not available
 for purchase.
- Space for tack and display is subject to availability. NO REFUNDS OF FEES WILL BE MADE.
- Feed for livestock may be brought in by exhibitors for their entries only or ordered from the official State Fair feed supplier. These orders shall be placed so that deliveries may be completed by 9:00 a.m. each morning.
- 6. Tie-Out Time Animals should be ready for viewing by the public by 8:00 a.m. each day and will remain in the wing, except when showing, until tie-out time, which will not be earlier than 7:00 p.m.
- All fans and misters are required to be placed overhead within the stall area. No fans or misters are allowed in the aisles.
- 8. No portable generators are allowed in the building.
- 9. Grooming chutes are not to be allowed in aisles.

Entry Information

- ENTER EACH ANIMAL IN THE NAME OF THE BONAFIDE OWNER, giving the registered name and number and date of birth of the animal. NEW THIS YEAR: Group class entries can be made on-line.
- Beef animals owned in partnership or by syndicate may be shown in the name of the partnership or syndicate only, except that at the time of entry,

- a determination will be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one partner or syndicate member. Animals must be shown the same way in group classes as they are in open single classes.
- 3. Any animal upon check-in that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks, or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show. For any female shown with a calf at side, the calf shall be the cow's recent natural calf, and the calf should be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.
- 4. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, use of false tail heads (or use of any false hair) with the exception of false tail switches, and the use of graphite, powderful, hemp, or other similar substances used externally. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals, or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. Various tests could include: a "white towel" or "white glove test". No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make-up areas.
- All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type tests to verify accuracy of parent age as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
- 6. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from
- 7. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.
- 8. Beef animals are required to have registration papers in the owner's name or a photocopy of valid papers in process for registration or transfer (to be collected by the Superintendent and forwarded to the appropriate Association) to be eligible to show. Each exhibitor will be required to present certificates of registration for his/her entries when called upon by the superintendent. No animal will be checked in without this identification.
- SUBSTITUTIONS will be accepted for animals in the same class only. Substitutions can be made only in the name of the original exhibitor-owner as listed on the entry form.

Premiums and Awards

NEW THIS YEAR – See premium scale for classes paid and monies awarded by class and placing.

I. Two premiums and two ribbons in each class and only one prize in group classes. EXCEPTIONS: Get-of-Sire where gets are by two different sires; Produce-of-Dam where produce is from two different dams; and Dam & Daughter class.

Rules Applicable to Beef Cattle

- No transfer or ownership of an animal will be made later than one hour prior to the beginning of the show.
 Please check your Association's rules as some require transfer to be on file by entry closing date.
- 2. Entries that have been mistakenly entered in a class may be transferred to the proper class prior to entering the show ring.
- 3. No bull over one year of age will be allowed on the grounds without a lead ring in his nose. All animals are required to be shown in halter.
- 4. All exhibitors in the Beef Cattle Show will be required to show their cattle at the call of the Superintendent. If an animal is excluded from competition, all entry fees and charges are forfeited without liability to the Kentucky State Fair Board.
- Cattle eligible for Kentucky classes must be Kentucky owned or co-owned and exhibited by a Kentucky residence.
- 6. A minimum of 20 head should be shown in the Open Class Division by breed. Any breed show that falls below 20 head shown will be notified in writing and put on a one-year probation. At the end of this one-year period, the Kentucky State Fair Board reserves the right to discontinue the show, the breed association will be responsible for under writing the cost of their breed show or they can show in the AOB division. The minimum investment required to continue a breed show is as follows:

I-10 head - minimum \$1,000 investment II- 19 head - minimum \$500 investment

ANGUS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds)
- 2. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree lookup. Exhibitors who participate in American Angus shows are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2 Association Rules. The rules relating directly to the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.
- 3. Any classes listed in this classification exceeding 15

- head per class should be broken into smaller classes. The class breaks will be at the discretion of the Kentucky State Fair Superintendent and the American Angus Association staff in attendance or Association designee.
- PREMIER EXHIBITOR and PREMIER BREEDER will receive banners, courtesy of the Kentucky Angus Association. Awards are open to Kentucky exhibitors only.

CHAROLAIS Special Rules:

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- Only Bona Fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership. NO PHOTOCOPIES
- Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.
- 4. All females 20 months and older exhibited at Al CA-sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinari an or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 5. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
- 6. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age.
- 7. Bulls from Classes 36, 37, 40, 41 and 42 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- 8. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the cow/calf class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2022. Calves are required to be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2022, should show in the individual female class most appropriate to age.
- 9. All exhibitors of Charolais Breeding Cattle shall be governed by the American-International Charolais Association rules and regulations, Article XV, Titled Exhibition of Animals. The inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in Article XV, Paragraph C, of the rules and regulations, and non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in paragraph D of the same Article XV.

CHIANINA Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. Partial interest owners must be active members of the ACA. Membership may be obtained by writing to the ACA, PO Box 890, Platte City, MO 64079 or by phoning 816-431-2808. Cattle will not be shown with an application for registration. All exhibitors shall be current members of the Kentucky Chianina/Chiangus Association. Dues may be accepted by the

- Breed Representative at check in.
- 3. In order to determine that animals are polled, scurred, or horned. NO ALTERING of the heads or removal of scurs from Chiangus cattle is permitted. IF A CHIANGUS HEAD HAS BEEN ALTERED IN ANY WAY, THAT ANIMAL WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW IN THE CHIANGUS DIVISION. All horned Chianina shall be dehorned prior to the show.

CHIANGUS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. See Rule 2 of the Chianina Special Rules
- 6.25% Rule Breeding cattle born on or after January I,
 2012, must have a minimum of 6.25% Chianina blood in order to participate in the Chiangus show.

GELBVIEH Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General `Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. Percentage and purebred Gelbvieh, purebred will show together. Full blood Gelbvieh bulls 75% to 100% will show together. For eligibility in the Balancer Show, an animal must have a combination of 25% to 75% Gelbvieh and 25% to 75% Angus or Red Angus with a maximum of 12.5% unknown or other breed, and the sire or dam must be recorded by the AGA, Ameri can Angus Association, or the Red Angus Association of America. A 75% Gelbvieh that qualified to show in both the Gelbvieh or Balancer show must choose which breed the animal will be entered into at the time of entry. An animal cannot show in both shows.
- 3. All females shown in cow/calf class with a calf over one hundred fifty (150) days of age should be bred back and must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a license veterinarian. Exception to the rule of safe in calf will apply to a donor female has produced fertile eggs in the previous twelve (12) months as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian. Show management will be responsible for checking the papers. Also, the age of calf at side in cow/calf class shall not exceed two hundred forty (240) days as of the date of the show.

HEREFORD Special Rules

- Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. Exhibitors who participate in the show shall follow American Hereford Association (AHA) show rules.
- If there are more than 10 animals in class, the AHA show committee may recommend that the class be split.
- No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded for the Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor. The same scoring system will be used for award points for the group classes.

LIMOUSIN Special Rules

I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle – General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.

- 2. All cattle shown, including calves at the side of the dam, must be: a) 75% (3/4) Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual), or greater, as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates, or b) purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Percentage, purebred, full blood, and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
- If show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules, exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
- 4. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation re serves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner.
- 5. Other Requirements to Receive Points at Level II Medal of Excellence (MOE) The following performance/data/ submission requirements must be met by December I to receive MOE points: Birth weight (bulls & heifers), weaning weights (bulls & heifers) yearling weight (bulls & heifers), yearling scrotal circumference (bulls only) pregnancy test (females older than 600 days at season's end), and breeding soundness exam and semen test (bulls older than 400 days). Note: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF by the deadline will result in disqualification from the MOE program, and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special requests from NALF.

RED POLL Special Rules

- Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- Cattle entered in the Kentucky State Fair should be purebred Red Polls duly registered in the Herd Book of the American Red Poll Association.
- Red Poll cattle 15/16ths or higher blood concentration level that have obtained Appendix Registry through the American Red Poll Association will be permitted to exhibit in this show.

SANTA GERTRUDIS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior members has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on his or her account.
- 3. In fitting all animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance: a) Purebred Fitting exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show. Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick, head clipped smooth, underline clipped blending sides, udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder, ears clipped as to environmental and

local standards, neck and brisket clipped, body clipped using common sense as to season, leg hair clipped (no star or Brahman clips) and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof, tailhead clipped, pull switch or brush out (no ball), trim tail (no shear except back side). The fitting handbook should be studied: b) Star Five Fitting – Star Five exhibits are not subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be fitted blow and go. Hair may be brushed according to preference with no foreign substances/fitting materials on any part of the body.

SHORTHORN AND SHORTHORNPLUS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. All heifers and bulls entered in the ShorthornPlus classes should be registered as ShorthornPlus and be at least 50% Shorthorn to be eligible to show in this class.
- 3. Senior Yearling Females who have calved will show based on age. The exhibitor can exhibit the female with or without the calf at side, it is NOT eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show; however, it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus Show.

PUREBRED SIMMENTAL Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. All females 24 months of age or older must possess a veterinarian's certificate stating that they are at least 90 days pregnant or must have calf at side.
- 3. All bulls 16 months and older must possess a certificate of viable semen from a veterinarian.
- 4. All cattle will be subject to age determination by mouthing at the discretion of the Kentucky Simmental Association and its agents. All decision are final as to age determination.
- Premier Breeder will be awarded on a point system as follows: Ist place animal – 3points, 2nd place animal – 2 points and 3rd place animal – I point. Joint ownership points will be awarded to all owners. (No points for groups)
- Premier Exhibitor will be awarded on a point system, the same as Premier Breeder.

SIMANGUS/SIMSOLUTIONS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- This show is open to animals that are half-blood Simmental up to less than "purebred" status and registered with the American Simmental Association (ASA). Sire and dam of animals must be registered with the ASA as Simmentals or as foundation animals.
- 3. Rules 2 thru 5 from the Purebred Simmental Special Rules also apply to Simangus/Simsoluations.

SALERS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. All animals shown in the Kentucky State Fair should be

- registered in the ASA Herdbook and may be Purebred, Fullblood, or 7/8 percent.
- 3. Use of false tailheads or the adding of any hair or hemp to the body of an animal shall be prohibited. The dying or artificially changing of the color of an animals shall be prohibited. Touch-up spray may only be used on the legs and tail switches, but none may be used above the flanks.
- 4. The surgical or nonsurgical alteration of the conformation of an animal is prohibited except for dehorning. This includes altering the conformation by typing up the dewlap or creating tucks by using adhesive on the dewlap, brisket, sheath, or navel. Cattle are to be shown in natural conformation. All animals entered in the show shall be dehorned.
- In Cow and Calf Classes, the cow will determine the class. Cow may be any age. Calf is required to be born January 1, 2023 or later. Calf can show in calf class. Cow and calf are not eligible for Grand Champion Heifer.

RED ANGUS Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- Only registered Red Angus cattle in Category IA
 (100%) and Category IB (87% through 99%) will be
 eligible to show. This specifically excludes cattle
 in Category II and Category III. It is mandatory that
 the Category and blood percentage be printed
 as the certificate states on all stall cards, show
 programs, and sale catalogs at the national and regional
 shows.
- 3. Cattle entered in any Red Angus show must be officially registered in one of the following: the Red Angus Association Herdbook, the Herdbook of the Canadian Angus Association, or any foreign Angus Association Herdbook recognized by the Red Angus Association of America
- 4. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed in Red Angus competition.
- 5. All females 20 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.
- 6. All bulls nine months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of American must be shown with a nose lead.

PIEDMONTESE Special Rules

- I. Please make sure to read the Beef Cattle General Information (All Breeds) Rules completely.
- 2. All animals shown are required to be Full-blooded.

AOB Special Rules

- I. All animals shown are to provide registration papers.
- Any breed that is in AOB that surpasses 20 head for two consecutive years can be eligible for their own breed show.
- 3. A minimum of 20 head should be shown in the Open Class Division by breed. Any breed show that falls below 20 head shown will be notified in writing and put on a one-year probation. At the end of this one-year period, the Kentucky State Fair Board reserves the right to discontinue the show, the breed association will be

responsibleunder writing the cost of their breed show or they can show in the AOB division. The minimum investment required to continue a breed show is as follows:

Entry Fee

Open - An entry fee of \$25.00 per head will be charged for all entries submitted by July 11. Production classes will be entered at time of check in. NEW THIS YEAR: Group classes can be made at entry time on the on-line entry system.

Extra Stall Tack Space - \$25.00 (see Stalling and Setup)
Youth - An entry fee of \$15.00 per head will be charged for all
4-H/FFA entries.

Open Late Entries: A late entry fee of \$100.00 per head will be charged for all entries submitted after July 11. Late entries shall be submitted through our online entry system by 11:59 p.m. on July 18. No late entries will be accepted in the 4-H/FFA Youth Livestock Show.

Stalling and Setup

- 1. The barn will open at 1:00 p.m., Monday, August 14, for set up of your stall area.
- 2. NEW FOR 2023: PURCHASE TACK SPACE (shall be done at time of submitting entries) Stalls and tack spaces are 3.5 foot wide. The cost is \$25.00 per stall/space and based on availability (no refunds). Purchase space is based on number of animals delivered to the show. DO NOT enter extra animals to scratch to get extra stall space.

Exhibitor group with I-5 head are allowed to purchase up to 3 additional tack spaces

Exhibitor group with 6-10 head are allowed to purchase up to 5 additional tack spaces

Exhibitor group with 11 - 15 head are allowed to purchase up to 8 additional tack spaces

Exhibitor group with over 15 head are allowed to purchase up to 10 additional tack spaces

Purchase your tack stalls through the on-line entry system and follow the link to the Stalling Request Form and complete. All exhibitors wanting to be tied together must complete the Form. All stalling requests shall be on the form and additional information can be sent to Dan Grigson by August 2 at danjgrigson@gmail.com.

- 3. Bedding is provided by the exhibitor. This may be brought from home or purchased at the Fair from the official state vendor. Storage of large quantities of feed and bedding in the building will not be permitted. Extra feed and bedding shall be kept in your trucks and trailers in the assigned parking area. Truckloads of sand, sawdust, shavings, or tan bark will not be permitted to dump in bulk in the barn. Large square bales are permitted for first bedding, but thereafter should be stored in a trailer. No KEC employees are permitted to move large bales. A one-day supply of hay or straw may be brought into the barn each day.
- 4. Entry fees do not dictate stall space. Exhibitors will receive one stall for each animal delivered to the Fair, regardless of the number of entries made. Space for tack and display is subject to availability. NO REFUNDS OF FEES WILL BE MADE.

Dairy Cattle Arrival and Release

- All 4-H and FFA dairy cattle can arrive beginning at 1:00 p.m. Monday, August 14 and should be on the grounds by 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 16.
- 2. All open dairy cattle can arrive beginning at 1:00 p.m. Monday, August 14. All open dairy cattle should be on the grounds by 4:00 p.m. Thursday, August 17.
- 3. Dairy cattle finished on Saturday, August 19, will be released at the conclusion of the last Saturday show.
- 4. Dairy cattle will be released on Sunday, August 20 at 3:30 p.m. All cattle and tack are required to be out of the barn by 7:00 p.m. Sunday, August 20. No overnight stay in the barn on Sunday night.

Entry Deadline: July 11

An animal owned by any person in the "Herd Unit" may be substituted for one owned by any other person in the "Herd Unit." Animals bred by any members of the "Herd Unit" will be considered

- as having been bred by the "Herd Unit."
- 3. Dairy animals eligible for Kentucky classes are required to be housed and maintained in Kentucky through the Kentucky State Fair show of the current year, transferred to a Kentucky resident at the breed association by August 1. Dairy animals eligible for Youth 4-H/FFA classes should be housed and maintained in Kentucky by June 1 through the Kentucky State Fair show of the current year. See the youth dairy rules for more specific information and eligibility for youth classes.
- 4. Animals owned in partnership or by syndicate may be shown in the name of the partnership or syndicate only, except that, at the time of entry, a determination will be made what animals will be shown in the name of one partner or syndicate member. Animals should be shown the same way in group classes, including State Herd, as they are in open single classes.
- 5. All dairy animals shall have registration papers in the owner's name or a photocopy of valid papers in process for registration or transfer (to be collected by the Superintendent and forwarded to the appropriate Association) to be eligible to show. No animal will be checked in without this identification.
- 6. SUBSTITUTIONS are allowed in the same class with the same owner or "Herd Unit." In addition, two (2) "Wild Card" open substitutions (out of class) will be allowed per "Herd Unit." Substitutions must be made within the same breed.
- 7. Animals in genetic recovery programs that are eligible for their respective National breed show are also eligible to show at the Kentucky State Fair.
- 8. A valid Social Security Number or Tax ID number is required when entering in order to receive a check for premiums won.
- 9. Reminder- review defined entries in youth show vs. open show. Entries in the youth show can only be made in the youth's name and payment for premiums will only be made to the youth registered for the shwo (see 4-H/FFA Livestock Rules for non-ownership animals and breed leases)
- 10. Entries can only be made through our online entry system at www.kystatefair.org ALL ENTRIES SHALL BE MADE IN THE NAME SHOWN ON THE REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE. EACH EXHIBITOR SHOULD BE ENTERED SEPARATELY.

NOTE:If a herd is registered in the names of immediate members of a family residing on the same farm, these persons may combine their entries as a "herd unit" and be considered as one exhibitor. In order to qualify as a "herd unit" all animals are required to be kept in the same herd. Rules Applicable to Dairy Cattle

 All competing animals will be exhibited in the ring at the discretion of the Superintendent. Any exhibitor failing to comply with the general rules applying to their

OPEN LIVESTOCK

- department will forfeit premiums.
- 2. Superintendents shall exclude livestock from competition if there is more than a 10-minute delay by the exhibitor in bringing the animal(s) into the show ring. If an animal is excluded from competition, all entry fees and charges are forfeited without liability to the Kentucky State Fair Board.
- 3. All animals in production classes, at the discretion of show management, are subject to ultrasound testing and/or milk sample testing and/or milk out evaluation pursuant to Kentucky Law KRS 246 dealing with unethical practices used in regard to livestock and the criminal penalties involved.
- 4. All breed Open Show Grand Champion and Open Show Reserve Grand Champions are required to be milk sampled following their showing and before milk out. Show officials will present testing procedures at the show ring to the exhibitor and monitor the sampling at the designated site.
- 5. Animals with abnormal test results are subject to disciplinary provisions by Show Management and the Kentucky State Fair Board, which may include: disqualification of animal with abnormal test, disqualification of all exhibitor's entries, forfeiture of awards/premiums, being banned from future exhibitions, and other sanctions. The exhibitor will be notified in written form of possible violation and will be invited to provide a written statement prior to defending the allegations in person. The Kentucky State Fair Board will consider test results, exhibitor's information, and the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) rules to make decisions on violations and penalties.
- Exhibitors will be required to wear show harnesses for all classes. No barbed or pronged halters are allowed.
- 7. Only one (I) handler per animal will be allowed in the rings for the Open Show.
- 8. Water Tanks cattle are to be watered in the exhibitor STALL area only.
- Cattle eligible for Kentucky classes must be Kentucky owned or co-owned and exhibited by a Kentucky residence.

Milking Parlor

First Milking – Tuesday Afternoon, August 15 Last Milking – Sunday Afternoon, August 20

 The Kentucky State Fair will again have a milking parlor for the convenience of the dairy exhibitors, and everyone is welcome to use it. Any exhibitor wishing

- to bring a portable milker for their own use must also bring milk cans.
- 2. All portable milking equipment shall pass sanitary inspection of Health Department personnel assigned to work with the milking facility.
- Milk from each exhibitor's cattle will be tested for the presence of antibiotics during the first milking and periodically throughout the show. We solicit your cooperation in only bringing milk of acceptable quality to the parlor.
- All bulks will be tested for antibiotics prior to delivery to a processing plant. Tanks of milk found to contain antibiotics shall be disposed of at the expense of exhibitors.
- Any exhibitor found offering milk for sale containing antibiotics shall be prohibited from selling milk for the remainder of the show.
- 6. The Kentucky State Fair Board may bar repeat or chronic violators from participating in the Fair.

Rules Applicable to Swine

- 1. Age classifications for the 2023 Swine Show: December 1, 2022 March 31, 2023.
- All competing swine will be exhibited in the ring at the discretion of the Superintendent. Any exhibitor failing to comply with the general rules applying to their department will forfeit premiums.
- 3. All breeds will show in successive order, with approximately 15-minute breaks between breed shows.
- 4. Oiling, hogs will not be allowed at the Kentucky State Fair; however, painting of hogs is accepted.
- 5. Any animals that, in the opinion of the judge, is being shown out of class shall not be awarded a prize.
- 6. All animals to be exhibited shall be properly checked in with show management prior to the show. Registration papers for purebreds must be presented at check-in.
- 7. Not more than three (3) animals from the same exhibitor shall be allowed to be shown in any one (1) class for individual animals.
- 8. All animals exhibited shall carry ear notches or ear tags identifying the litter to which they belong.
- 9. All animals exhibited shall have been born December 1, 2022 March 31, 2023. Purebred breeding swine will be broken into classes based on age. Crossbred breeding swine will be broken into classes based on weight. Exhibitors of Crossbred breeding swine will need to turn in a weight card declaring weights.
- All prize money of any exhibitor failing to comply with foregoing rules, or found guilty of or party to any irregularity in connection with the show, shall be forfeited.
- 11. See Open Market Hog Division for additional rules

- 13. In order to create a good public image and add to the attractiveness of the livestock all beds, cots bedding, etc., shall be made up and out of aisles by 8:00 am.

Open Market Hog Division

- Animals exhibited in the 4-H/FFA Youth Market Hog `Division and Breeding Gilt Division are eligible to compete in the Open Market Hog Division.
- Both market gilts and barrows are eligible to compete in the Open Market Hog Division. Gilts exhibited in the Open Breeding Swine Division may not be shown in the Open Market Division.

- Exhibitors will declare weights of market hogs (an
 official weigh-in will not be conducted by show
 officials). The following procedures and guidelines will
 be used by exhibitors to declare weights of market
 hogs.
- 4. All market hogs shall weigh between 220 and 285 pounds. There will be no variance from this weight range.
- 5. At least the top three placing market hogs in each class will be weighted by the Swine Superintendent or their representative as the animals leave the show ring. Any market hog that weighs 15 pounds over its official declared weight will be disqualified. No premiums will be paid on disqualified animals.
- 6. Open market hogs will be shown in classes of 5 to 15 animals divided by breed and weight. A breed shall be represented by fifteen (15) animals to have a separate class for that breed. All open market hogs shown in a breed class shall have a registration certificate issued by the respective breed association showing animal identification and ownership, and the animal shall exhibit typical breed characteristics. The sex may be listed as boar on the pedigrees for barrows. Fifteen (15) head minimum are required for purebred classes. If fewer than fifteen (15) head are present, they will go into a "Light AOB" or "Dark Purebreds" category. If these two categories have fewer than fifteen (15) head, they will be combined into an "All Other Breeds" category.
- A Breed Champion from each purebred division will be selected in the Open Market Hog Show. The Breed Champions from each purebred division will compete with the crossbred division winners for Grand Champi on Open market hog.
- 8. The crossbred classes will be equally distributed into three (3) weight divisions: Light Weight, Medium Weight, and Heavy Weight. The three (3) crossbred division winners will compete with the Breed Champions from each purebred division for Grand Champion open market hog.
- Open Market Hog Division exhibitors are responsible for removing their animals from the grounds at the conclusion of the show. Show management WILL NOT be responsible for removing animals from the grounds.

Open Breeding Swine Division

- At the time of entry, all purebred animals entered in this department, including pigs under six (6) months old, shall be properly named and recorded in the Herd Book of the breed association to which they belong.
- All Berkshire swine shall be registered by the American Berkshire Association (ABA), 2637 Yeager Road, West Lafayette, IN 47906. Said registration paper should be presented at the time of check-in. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).
- 3. All animals placing will be checked for ear notches or ear tags, and registration papers will be required for

purebred animals.

- 4. All hogs to be eligible to compete shall have been owned by the exhibitor for at least sixty (60) days prior to the opening day of the Kentucky State Fair. For purebred animals, the day of purchase shall be construed to be the date transfer that is recorded with the Record Association.
- 5. All purebred pigs shown should be registered in the Record Associations of the breeds to which they belong and should be in the name of the exhibitor. All purebred pigs shall exhibit typical breed characteristics. Exhibitors must be prepared to show certificates of registry and proper transfer for all purebred animals

Entry Fee

An entry fee of \$25 per head will be charged for all entries submitted by 11:59 p.m. on July 11.

LATE ENTRIES: Double entry fee (\$100 per head) will be charged for all entries submitted after July 18.

Admission

2023 ADMISSION TICKET CHANGES: Each exhibitor is required to purchase a \$25 Livestock Exhibitor Admission Badge (each badge has unlimited scans). This badge is assigned to the individual and is NOT usable to admit multiple people at the gate. Additional individual admission badges may be purchased for \$25. This badge will also serve as a barn access badge.

- Each exhibitor can purchase one (I) individual packet of exhibitor tickets, containing II admission/parking tickets for \$44.
- Both exhibitor badges and tickets may only be purchased online during the Entry process.
- Barn Access Only badges are required to enter the barn when closed to the public. Each exhibitor will be provided two (2) barn access only badges. This badge does not include Fair admission/parking.
- Any additional Kentucky State Fair admission or parking tickets may be purchased from the KEC Box Office at the normal public rate.
- If an exhibitor misplaces a badge, a replacement badge can be issued for \$35.00.

- 2. The name of the exhibitor, as entered on the online entry form, shall be the same name as the current owner. Each exhibitor should be entered separately through the online entry system.
- A valid Social Security Number or Tax ID is required when entering in order to receive a check for any premiums won.
- 4. Mare and Colt is considered one of the entry.
- 5. An exhibitor may request an early release only in the event they are participating in an overlapping state fair or livestock show. The request for early release can be submitted to the Kentucky State Fair Entry Department and the Mule & Jack Stock Superintendent up until the time of check-in at the Kentucky State Fair. The request shall include the contact information for the indicated state fair or livestock show to confirm participation. Per mission will not be granted until the exhibitor's participation is verified by the indicated state fair or livestock show listed in the request.
- Animals will be released at 1:30 pm on Monday, August 21.

Stalling and Setup

 All bedding shall be provided by exhibitor. This may be brought from home or purchased at the Fair from the official state vendor. No bulk sawdust, tan bark, or shavings are permitted. Only baled or bagged bedding is allowed. 2. Exhibitors should bring their own watering troughs.

General Mules & Jack Stock Information

- All livestock entries should enter through Gate 4 off Crittenden Drive. Any trailer bringing livestock to the Fair which is to remain on the grounds throughout the show period and should park in the area designated by the Superintendent or the Kentucky State Fair Board.
- 2. In classes for young stock, the breeder's written statement of time of birth must be produced upon demand of judge or superintendent.
- All jacks four years old and over must have proved themselves to be sires. Aged jacks and jennets will be reckoned from date of birth.
- 4. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter or bridle and the owner or employee shall be charge.
- 5. Each animal must be in show condition and deemed worthy by the judge to receive premiums,

- 6. Mules shall be entered in the appropriate class to compete in mule hitches.
- No employee of the Kentucky State Fair nor any member of their immediate household can own or exhibit any animals in any competition in which said employee is directly affiliated.
- 8. Any dog on the grounds of the Kentucky Exposition Center during the Kentucky state Fair by law should be on a leash and controlled by owner. Service dogs are permitted on the grounds. Any dog running f ree will be impounded and removed from the grounds.

- State Police are located outside the West Hall near the W8 overhead door.
